

THRIVER CIRCLE COMMUNITY CHARTER

By joining the Circle, you promise to abide by our Community Charter.

{This is an interim Charter, subject to change after the recommendations of our Foundation Members.}

Members Agree That:

- It's about cooperation, not competition. There is enough pie for everyone, and by helping each other out, we all flourish.
- Everyone is equal. No matter who you are, what you do, what you create, and where you are in your journey, you are a valued member of the Circle – no-one is 'better' than anyone else.
- Diversity is beautiful. We are a diverse group of people from all over the world. We all have different life experiences, and we all have valuable wisdom to share, no matter where we are in our journey.
- Positivity is productive. We will always aim to be positive in our thinking and interactions – looking for the good and knowing that there is always a solution if we look at things from enough angles.
- Support is give and take. We will ask for help when we need it, secure in the knowledge that the Circle is full of caring, generous, and supportive people who will share their wisdom with us when we need it. And we, in return, will look for opportunities to give back when we see someone struggling with an issue we can help them with.

Members of the Circle Will Not:

- Share information outside the Circle that has been shared by other members within the Circle. This is a private, safe space to ask tough questions, deal with potentially sensitive issues (like customer service challenges), and share plans. Members need to feel comfortable sharing this sort of information without the fear that someone might share the info outside the group.
- Personally attack any other member in the group. Constructive discussion is encouraged, and constructive criticism is encouraged *when asked for*, but name-calling, swearing, and other forms of aggression are not acceptable.
